

LESSON OVERVIEW

Big Idea: The cure for the "gimmies" is being happy with what God has given you

Key Question: What does it mean to be greedy?

Memory Verse: *And this same God who takes care of me will supply all your needs from his glorious riches, which have been given to us in Christ Jesus. **Philippians 4:19***

Overview: We're continuing in our series called, "How Stuff Works". It's important to know how stuff works so we don't make mistakes that can hurt us or those we care about. We've already learned how our feelings should work. God created us to have them but we need to know how to control them. Last week, we learned about friendship. God designed us to want to have friends but we need to choose the right kind of friends. Our friends will rub off on us, for the good or the bad. We become more like the people we hang around. So, we need to choose our friends wisely! Today, we're going to talk about greed. Greed is just a fancy word for when you have the "gimmies". You know, when you want something you don't really need. Here's how the "gimmies" work. You go to the grocery store with your mom and you see yummy chips or cereal and you say, "Mom! I want this or I want that!" Or, you go to your friend's house and they have the cool new game, so you go home and say, "Mom, I have to have it because everyone else has it!" See how that works? Greed, or the "gimmies", gets us in trouble because our focus is on stuff. We don't NEED stuff, but we might WANT stuff. It's important to know the difference. God doesn't want us to be greedy. He wants to cure us of the "gimmies". The cure is being thankful for what we already have!

CLASSROOM AGENDA

- 5 min **PLAY:** Begin working on Activity Page #1.
- 5 min **WARM UP:** Make a list of things kids really want. (cool games/gaming systems, clothes, phones etc) Why do kids want those things?
- 5 min **PREVIEW:** Write out the Big Idea and Memory Verse and Key Question on a whiteboard. Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1. (if applicable)
- 20 min **LARGE GROUP:** Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to small group to finish this guide.
- 5 min **RECAP:** Read the **Lesson Overview** from the Teacher's Guide to the class and then **answer** the KEY QUESTION.
- 5 min **EXPLORE:** Read [Ecclesiastes 5:10-11](#). Why do people with money never think they have enough? What happens if we only chase stuff money can buy?
- 10 min **PLAY:** Do the group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 5 min **CLOSE:**
 - Do you have a case of the "gimmies"? What are you going to do about it?
 - Share prayer requests and pray as a class.

TEACHER TIPS

Don't forget that you set the tone for your kids. Smile. Have fun. Pursue God together.

Allow each kid to share. The point: We all want the latest and greatest stuff but our stuff doesn't make us happy.

Answer: A greedy person is always looking for more stuff and never happy with what they have. God doesn't want us to be greedy. Greed puts the focus on the wrong thing-stuff. Our toys, games, and clothes won't make us happy. There will always be something bigger or better. So, we need to put our focus on what does matter-God! He knows what we need and he will give us what we need.

Bonus Questions: How does greed get us into trouble? What are some things you want but don't need?

4-5th: Why doesn't our stuff really make us happy? What usually happens to greedy people?

It's just in our nature to want more. We want the newest game or the better gadget and that takes money. And, once you buy the game or gadget you want, a better one comes out. It's an endless cycle of wanting more. The Bible warns us that chasing stuff will never make us happy. Only God knows what truly makes us happy and he promises to give us what we **NEED**, not always what we **WANT**. Don't waste your time and money on stuff. Put your focus on God and what he's blessed you with already.

Allow each kid to share. Encourage them to be thankful for what they already have.

ACTIVITY PAGE #2

Classroom Activities K-1st

Option #1

Gimmie Heart vs. Happy Heart Game

- Draw a large heart on the whiteboard and draw a line to divide it in half
- Write "Gimmie" on one side and "Happy" on the other
- Have kids take turns drawing a little heart saying (**pg 5**) out of a basket. Have kids read the saying (**or teacher can**) to the class and decide if it belongs on the "Gimme" side or the "Happy" side. Have the kid tape it to the correct side
- Continue having kids pull a saying until all have been placed on the heart
- Remind kids that we should be happy for what we have instead of suffering from the "gimmies" by wishing we had more

Supplies needed

- whiteboard
- whiteboard markers
- little heart sayings (pg 5) pre cut, one set per class
- tape
- bowl/basket

Bonus Activity:

Play **Find the Book in the Bible**

Have class get into pairs. Give each pair a Bible. Have them race to find the books below. First to find has to say if it's in the OT or NT.

Books: Psalms, Luke, 2 John

Option #2

Gimmie Heart vs. Happy Heart Craft

- Give each kid a pre cut heart and sayings template (**pg 6**)
- Have them color the left side of the heart black and the other half red
- Have them glue the word "Gimmie" at the top of the black side and the word "Happy" at the top of the red side
- As a class, read each little heart saying and decide if it goes on the "Gimmie" side or the "Happy" side. Then have kids glue it on the correct side
- Remind kids that the only cure for the "gimmies" is being happy with what you already have

Supplies needed

- heart and sayings template (pg6), one set per kid, pre cut
- crayons
- glue





