#### **LESSON OVERVIEW**

Big Idea: What God gives us is good for us.

Key Question: How does God know what's good for us?

Memory Verse: Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Proverbs 3:5

Overview: We're continuing in our series about what it really means to be a Christian. A Christian is just another name for a follower of Jesus. Last week we learned what a "kinda sorta" Christian is all about. A "kinda sorta" Christian says they believe in God but they don't make him a priority. We learned that God wants to be our best friend. In order for us to know God like a best friend, we have to spend time with him by doing things like reading our Bible and praying. Today, we're going to talk about how we should relate to God. A "kinda sorta" Christian treats God like their favorite fast food restaurant. They tell God what they want in life and expect that it will be exactly as they say. But that's not how God works. We don't tell God what we want. He tells us what we should want. After all, God is the God of the whole universe. He can see everything from beginning to end. He knows what we need. We may think we know what we want but we don't. A true Christian trusts that God knows what is best. Instead of telling God what we want, we should ask God to show us what he wants for us. We should trust that no matter what comes along in life. God's plan is best.

**PLAY:** Do the group activity from Activity Page #2.

CLOSE:

What did you learn from the lesson today?

Share prayer requests and pray as a class.

#### **TEACHER TIPS**

Don't forget that you set the tone for your kids. Smile. Have fun. Pursue God together.

Allow each kid to share. The point: We all love going to our favorite restaurant and ordering our food just how we like it. Some people think that's how it works with God. We can order up our life just how we want it. But, that's not true.

Answer: Because God knows everything and he created each and every one of us!

God created this world and everything in it. He knows how things are suppose to work. He knows what's good for us and he knows the dangers we should avoid. And, because God created each one of us, he knows exactly what we need when we need it.

Bonus Questions: What are some of your favorite things God has created? What are some unique qualities God has given

4-5th: Why should we trust God with our lives?

God is the source of our purpose and strength. He gives us everything we need in this life. If we choose to obey and follow his plan for our lives, we will accomplish way more than we ever could on our own. God knows everything, including us. He has a plan and we should follow it.

Allow each kid to share.

# Option #1

#### The "?" Craft

- Give each kid a "?" craft template (page 5)
- Have kids cut out the square craft
- As a class, follow the instructions on how to fold the square to make the "?" craft work (works like a cootie catcher or fortune teller game)
- Then, have kids get in pairs and play the "?" game
  - Game works by one kid holding their "?" craft on their fingers and their partner starts by choosing a color.
  - Once chosen, the kid holding the craft moves their fingers in and out while spelling the color they chose.
  - Then the partner chooses a number and the kid holding the craft counts off the number chosen while moving fingers in and out.
  - Have the partner choose a number again and the kid counts it off
  - Then, the partner chooses another number and the kid opens that flap which reveals two questions. The kid with the craft asks the question to their partner, who then answers the question.
  - Have kids switch roles.

### Supplies needed

- "?" craft template (pg 5), one per kid
- scissors

# Option #2

#### God is.....Bible Hangman

- Put the pre cut hangman words (page 6) in a bowl
- Draw a hangman template on the whiteboard
- Choose one kid to come up and draw out a word from the bowl. Have them put the blanks on the board for each letter of the word
- Have the kid call on other kids to guess letters and have them fill in the correct letters in their proper blank. If wrong, have them write those letters to the side and draw a portion of the hangman's body
- See if the class can solve the puzzle before the hangman is drawn





#### Instructions:

- 1. Cut out your the "?" craft square from the paper
- 2. Fold the square in half and in half again
- 3. Open up the square and flip over
- 4. Fold each corner into the middle
