Psalm 139 - God Pursues You

LESSON #5

TEACHER'S GUIDE

LESSON OVERVIEW

Big Idea: God wants to be in your life. **Key Question:** Why do we need God?

Memory Verse: Lord, You have examined my heart and know everything about me. Psalm 139:1

Overview: Today, we're looking at the most popular psalm, Psalm 139. Psalms are like songs or poems people wrote to God a long time ago. Some were sad and some were happy. This psalm was written by king David. He was writing about how big God is that He can be everywhere and know everything! You know what is even more amazing? God knows each of us, everything about us. God knows how we think, what we fear, and what makes us happy. He knows the great things about us and He knows the things we're not so proud of. But, He loves us anyways. You know why He knows everything about us? Because, He created us, loves us, and wants to be in relationship with us! God didn't create us by accident. He carefully created each one of us with special abilities and talents. God wants to be in our lives. He wants US to want HIM in our lives. He doesn't force us to follow him. He gives us a choice. David understood this and that's why he wrote this psalm. He was worshipping God, praising Him for being so big, and inviting God to be a part of his life.

EXPLORE: Read <u>Jeremiah 31:33</u>. A covenant is a promise. What is God promising to do in this verse? What are God's instructions? What does it mean that they are written on our hearts?

PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.

CLOSE:

- What attribute that God gave you are you most thankful for?
- ☐ Share prayer requests and pray as a class.

TEACHER TIPS

Don't forget that you set the tone for your kids. Smile. Have fun. Pursue God together.

Allow each kid to share. The point: We have to describe things about ourselves for others to know who we are. But, God already knows everything about us.

Answer: We need God for a lot of reasons here are the top 3:

- 1. To save us (from our sins)
- 2. To protect us (from danger)
- 3. To lead us (to live a life that honors Him and fulfill our purpose)

Remember, God created each one of us. He knows everything about us and He knows what we need. We can't get to heaven without Him. We can't live under His protection without Him, and we can't live a life that honors Him without His leading.

Bonus Questions: Who died on the cross to pay for our sins? (Jesus). How does God lead us? (gave us the Bible and his Holy Spirit to guide us on the right path)

4-5th: Why did Jesus have to die? (sins) Give some examples from the Bible of how we should live? (don't lie, forgive, love)

God promised that He would help us to find relationship with Him again. Even though sin got in the way of that relationship, God had a plan. The "new" covenant was all about sending Jesus to pay for our sins and giving us the Holy Spirit and the Bible to help us to live a life that honors God. This new covenant was about an inward change. Our hearts are made new when we trust in Jesus and then we want to follow after Him

Allow each kid to share their favorite quality. (hair color, height, freckles, funny, smart, etc.)

ACTIVITY PAGE #2

Classroom Activities 2nd-5th

Option #1

God's Secret Message Plate

- Put newspaper or butcher paper down on tables or just use paper towels for clean up after activity
- Give each kid a paper plate (hidden message already written on it).
- Put watercolors and brushes on the tables for kids to paint over their plates. Tell them to use a different colors to make it look colorful.
- As they paint, tell them to watch for the secret message to appear.
- Bonus: If you have time, give kids another plate and a white crayon and let them write a nice secret message for their neighbor in the class. Have each kid paint to discover this secret message.

Supplies needed

- white paper plates with the message "God knows you" on plates with white crayon, 1 per kid
- white crayon
- newspaper/butcher for tables
- water color paints
- brushes
- extra white plates (bonus)
- white crayons (bonus)
- paper towels (for clean up)

Bonus Activity:

Play the **Fill in the Blank** game. Put dashes on the whiteboard for every word in the **Big Idea**. Slowly start adding letters and see who's first to guess what it says.

Option #2

Scavenger Hunt Memory Verse

- Before the kids return from large group (or just have kids close eyes and put heads down), hide the words from the memory verse around the room (pg 5).
- Have the class explore the room to find the words to the verse.
- Once a kid finds a paper, they have to quit looking so others kids have a chance to find one.
- Once all the words are found, have kids put the words in the correct order to say the verse.

Supplies needed

- white paper
- scavenger hunt words template (pg 5), pre cut




