

The Walking Dead | Get Rich #3 (Youth)

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One of the most popular cable TV shows of the last several years is called *The Walking Dead*. It's the latest story in the beloved sci-fi zombie genre about the undead – those who are dead but still able to walk around causing problems. But the truth is, this isn't just science fiction, it's the way the Bible describes the reality of how we are as humans.

Life as the living dead

Ephesians 2:1-3 *Once you were dead because of your disobedience and your many sins. You used to live in sin, just like the rest of the world, obeying the devil—the commander of the powers in the unseen world. He is the spirit at work in the hearts of those who refuse to obey God. All of us used to live that way, following the passionate desires and inclinations of our sinful nature. By our very nature we were subject to God's anger, just like everyone else.*

The Bible says that our sin makes us dead. It's not talking about physical death, but spiritual death. While we may be alive physically, the negative consequence of sin has killed our souls. Sin pulls us away from God, who is the source of life. Without his Spirit in us, we have no spiritual life.

As “spiritual zombies,” this passage says we're owned by dangerous forces including the Devil, the sinful world around us, and our own sinful desires. These spiritual forces lead us to spiral more and more toward pain and death. The ultimate consequence of this sin is eternal death.

God's rescue plan

The situation we find ourselves in is pretty serious. But there is some amazingly good news in the Bible.

Ephesians 2:4-6 *But God is so rich in mercy, and he loved us so much, that even though we were dead because of our sins, he gave us life when he raised Christ from the dead. (It is only by God's grace that you have been saved!) For he raised us from the dead along with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms because we are united with Christ Jesus.*

Verse four contains two of the greatest words in the Bible: “but God.” God loves us too much to leave us where we are. In order to rescue us from death, he chose to die himself. Jesus, as God in flesh, received the ultimate punishment of death on the cross that we deserve. God then raised Jesus from the dead. His promise to all who trust in Jesus is that his new life will become ours. Just as his death counts for us, his new life counts for us.

It's normal to think we have to earn God's gift, but no matter how hard we tried, we could never be worthy. So God offers this gift to all who would simply believe and put their faith in Jesus Christ.

Ephesians 2:8-9 *God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it.*

Our rescue is not a reward for anything we do, it is a gift we receive by faith. Anytime we try to rescue ourselves, we only mess up! But then, after we experience this rescue through Jesus and are made alive in Him, that is when real life begins.

Now we can really be alive

Before Christ, we looked like we were alive on the outside, but inside – in our souls – we were dead. But after we accept Christ as our savior we can start to truly live the lives God has planned for us.

Ephesians 2:10 *For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago.*

God's desire for us is to not just simply live, but to have meaning and purpose. He has a journey of "good things" waiting for us to do. God's rescue plan isn't an excuse for you to sin all you want, but it's an invitation for you to start a pursuit of Him. Your pursuit of God starts with trusting Jesus, then living to honor God, and then going full circle to help others pursue God.

Are you a "spiritual zombie" who looks alive on the outside but is dead on the inside? Or are you truly alive? If you realize that you're a "zombie," the good news is that God has provided a rescue plan for you to truly live through faith in Jesus.

Discussion Questions:

1. Watch the video together or invite someone to summarize the topic.
2. What is your initial reaction to this video? Do you disagree with any of it? What jumped out at you?
3. Do you have a favorite zombie movie/show? Why do you think these are so popular and common?
4. Read [Ephesians 2:1](#). What does it mean that we are "dead" in our sins? Why is this such a serious situation?
5. Describe the different spiritual forces referred to in vs. 2-3. How do each of these have a negative effect on our life?
6. Have you ever been rescued from something? Share the quick story. How did that rescue make you feel?
7. Read [Ephesians 2:4](#) Why do you think God chose to rescue us rather than just letting us experience the consequences we deserve? What drives His love and mercy?
8. Why were the cross and the resurrection both necessary for this rescue plan?
9. Read [Ephesians 2:8-9](#). Why do you think Paul had to make the point that we can't take credit for our salvation? What is it about humans that makes us want to, or feel like we have to, earn our salvation?
10. Read [Ephesians 2:10](#). Describe what some elements of what new life can and should look like for the Christian. Be specific.
11. Write a personal action step based on this conversation.
