A “grid,” or worldview, is just the way that you understand the world. Lots of things can shape your understanding, like your family, your experiences, and even movies, music, and social media. As Christians, we ultimately want to see the world like Jesus does, and we want our worldview to be shaped by biblical truth.

Everyone you know has a worldview

Friends, teachers, movie stars, everyone. For example, each of your teachers in school have a worldview that impacts the things they teach. This doesn't make them bad teachers, but it's good to know this in advance as you are learning from them. As Christians, we want to have a biblical worldview, or “grid,” so we can know when we are being taught things that aren't biblical.

Discussion Questions:

1. Watch the video together or invite someone to summarize the topic.
2. What is your initial reaction to this video? Do you disagree with any of it? What jumped out at you?

3. *Define what a worldview is.*
4. *Share an example of someone who has a different worldview than you (it could just be a difference of opinion on a particular issue.)*
5. *Why are the secular ideas mentioned in the video so dangerous? What are some of the possible consequences of believing these things?*
6. *Why do we want a biblical worldview? Why isn't it easy and natural for us to have a biblical worldview?*
7. *If seeing the world like Jesus ultimately leads to our joy, what is one step we can take in the next week to start developing a more Jesus-centered worldview?*
8. *Write a personal action step based on this conversation.*
